INTRODUCTION
TO
CHRIST IN THE BIBLE Series

When Dr. Simpson inaugurated this Series he stated that the proposed volumes were not "an attempt to compete with valuable works" published in the last few years. Rather his intent was "to unfold the spiritual teachings of the Scriptures, especially with reference to the Person and work of Christ." (preface, Genesis, Exodus, 1888 edition, page vii.) Accordingly he planned three parts for each volume.

1. An analysis of the spiritual teaching of the biblical book.
2. Original and selected homiletic helps and illustrative materials.
3. Historical and geographical papers illustrative of the various books and subjects.
(ibid, p.viii)

He also stated that "two causes have chiefly led to the publication of these volumes."

1. The desire of friends "to obtain in a permanent form the substance of the Bible teaching given at the Missionary Training College where most of these lectures were originally delivered."
2. "The call that comes to help the increasing number of consecrated Christians who are hungering for a deeper spiritual life and for a more profound acquaintance with the Word of God as it unfolds the fulness of Christ as Saviour, Sanctifier, Healer and Coming Lord."

It is instructive to note the time of the above statements, 1888. The Christian Alliance and The Missionary Alliance had just been organized at Old Orchard in August of 1887. Simpson desired to help an increasing constituency. But "the times" also explain why the original impulse was never completed. The burgeoning Alliance demanded more and more of Simpson's time and his literary efforts suffered. You will notice in column one which follows that only seven volumes were published and two of those were not according to the proposed pattern. They were sermons. Five volumes appeared in 1888, 1889, and 1891, but the other two (sermons) waited until 1894. Then the Series went on the "back-burner" until 1902, - not a fault, but an abundance of other responsibilities were consuming his time and energies.

In 1902 Simpson set out to re-issue this series in five sets of six volumes each set, i.e. 30 volumes. They were to be uniform in binding and sell for \$1.00 per volume, or \$5.00 for a set of six. The first set was to go from Genesis to David - Solomon. (see page 318, Christian Alliance, June 1902)

In September 1908, p. 398 Simpson announced that the N.T. series was to be issued. It would cover all of the N.T. and be published in 12 volumes. Needless to say, his purposes were never realized.

So the second column indicates Simpson's attempt to complete the Series at least with sermons. He did re-publish previous

volumes I-III, X (John only) and XI, but with the omission of the homiletical helps. Between 1894-1902, most of Simpson's sermons were regularly printed in his periodicals and many were gathered and published as books. Some of these books he re-titled and included them in the Series. Others, like the sermons on the Synoptic Gospels, were published immediately as part of the Series. (This is true also of Isaiah, Acts and II Corinthians.) The bibliography will give more details.

In the third column are the volumes of the Series published after Simpson's death. The publishing company moved to Harrisburg, PA and soon thereafter changed its name to Christian Publications, Inc. This name continues to the present. You will note that the majority of the volumes are identical to column number 2. However, a couple of new volumes were added, - books previously published under another title, and one volume was dropped, - i.e. Revelation. Timothy and Titus were published for the first time in book form with Thessalonians. *

Following is a list of the probable three different publication periods of the CHRIST IN THE BIBLE series. Note that there are some changes in the volume numbers.

* Note that the Penteteuch and the Gospel of John remained virtually the same in the three periods, - no sermons. But Simpson preached a number of sermons on these biblical books.
